Pastor's Letter

“To offer hope to our community and world through the Good News, and to make disciples of Jesus Christ”

based on Matthew 28:19

Greetings Church Family and Friends,

Hope everyone is healthy and preparing to get back to a little bit of “normal” as the COVID restrictions are being lifted. We will continue to be safe, by honoring individual’s preference to wear masks or not; we will continue sanitizing of the building for precautionary measures.

Memorial Day (May 30/31) loved-ones are remembered, graduations completed or underway, and the unofficial beginning of the summer season. Life is a series of celebrations, commemorations and events. To our graduates, we will honor you this Sunday May 30th, and keep you in our prayers; let God lead you on life’s journey. A word to everyone: Seek God, have faith, do good and show grace; be God’s witness in the world. God gives us the ability of power of the Holy Spirit which Jesus sent to us on the **Day of Pentecost** (the fiftieth day following Passover and Easter- which we celebrated last Sunday May 23rd. **(Acts2:1-13)**

We are living in the days when the Holy Spirit is at work. On Pentecost, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to the Church; God’s power is given so that the work that Jesus begun could continue. We continue the same work today with the same Holy Spirit sent from Heaven. The Spirit works in us, so God can be known in the world.

As followers of Jesus, our energy comes from God, Jesus himself and the Holy Spirit, who works in us. The work of God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit, the *Three in One: The Trinity* working in the Church, the *“body of Christ.”* We are to show Jesus to the world.

Pastors retiring from ministry are honored, and we meet those just beginning ministry with commissioning and ordination services. Clergy who are moving and preparing for new adventures, receive God’s blessing. *(Our lay-delegate again this year is Connie Secrest; and I Pastor Jeff Coggins represent you. You will hear from us at a later date.)*

*A reminder: things voted on and passed, or voted down, **at Annual Conference, do not** change things for the denomination; denominational changes and decisions for the Global Church, can only be made by **General Conference** which is scheduled for next Aug 29th – Sept 6th, 2022 in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Don’t Forget Father’s Day June 20th. *[also the first day of summer]* This is a day to honor our dads and the men who have been examples to us, showing their love by their hard work each day. *Dads do not always get things right; sometimes they [we] learn along the way.* As children [sons and daughters], we learn life’s lessons and grow; in time, we learn to love our dads thru the hard times of discipline, and the greater lessons of love and forgiveness. God our heavenly Father, loves us, disciplines us, shows us love and forgives us. Jesus gives us the Spirit and teaches us to love and forgive one another; this is the way God’s grace works, and grace makes life complete.






On Memorial Day a national moment of remembrance takes place at 3:00 p.m. local time.




Women and children bathe, wash clothes and gather drinking water from a muddy pond, fed by a small stream near Homoine, Mozambique.
