I'm not sure if life is that leisurely these days. Maybe it should be, but May is a busy month, full of observances, celebrations, and times of preparation for graduations, and getting ready for summer. Busy and exciting times.

May 5<sup>th</sup>. Cinco De Mayo, is a Mexican holiday, but I do like a good Mexican dinner every now and then. Sometimes Taco Bell will do. This year May 5<sup>th</sup> is the National Day of Prayer; which marks the 34<sup>th</sup> year since President Ronald Reagan in 1988 designated the first Thursday in May each year to be a day of prayer for our nation. Please pause for a time of prayer any day, and pray for our nation, leaders, and communities. By the time you read this, many in Caldwell will have gathered at the courthouse to pray; your Church pastors and community leaders have prayed and continue to ask for God's direction and blessings.



# Golden Spike Day





On May 10, 1869 at Promontory Point, Utah, California Governor Leland Stanford, (who was also President of the Central Pacific Railroad) struck the final spike in the Pacific Railroad to connect the Union Pacific and Central Pacific Railroads, whose joining made it possible for Americans to travel from coast to coast with far less potential for danger than they could in wagon trains. The spike had been manufactured earlier that year especially for the event by the William T. Garratt Foundry in San Francisco. Two of the sides were engraved with the names of the railroad officers and directors. A special tie of polished California laurel was chosen to complete the line where the spike would be driven.

Immediately afterwards, the golden spike and the laurel tie were removed, lest they be stolen, and replaced with a regular iron spike and normal tie. At exactly 12:47 pm, the last iron spike was driven, finally completing the line.

## Mother's Day Fun Facts



Reportedly there are approximately 122 million calls made on the second Sunday of May every year.

During and following the Civil War, Ann Jarvis made a concerted effort to foster friend-ship and community between the mothers on both sides of the war. She started a committee in 1868 which established the first glimmer of today's holiday: "Mother's Friendship Day." Ann's daughter Anna continued her legacy by creating the official holiday. The first Mother's Day was celebrated in 1908.





Anna Reeves Jarvis used the carnation on Mother's Day to symbolize whether your mother was living. A red carnation meant she was, and a white meant she had passed.

This day is held in remembrance of the first comic strip featured in a newspaper It also honors all cartoonists, past and present, and their amazing creations. On May 5, 1895, the Sunday morning paper held a little surprise for its readers. Readers of the New York World discovered a single-strip, full-color drawing of a big-eared, barefoot little boy with a mischievous grin. Created by American comic strip writer and artist Richard Outcault, this comic strip (called "Hogan's Alley," and later, "The Yellow Kid") became the very first commer-

cially successful cartoon.

# National Nurses Week – May 6-12, 2022

From assisting with life-threatening ER crises to delivering babies and caring for the elderly in their last moments, nurses perform some of the most difficult and heartbreaking tasks in the medical world. As workers who perform the most essential healthcare tasks, nurses serve as the first point of contact for most patients.



National Nurses Week honors their contributions and sacrifices and reminds us to thank the medical professionals who keep us healthy. It is celebrated between May 6, National Nurses Day, and May 12, the birthdate of celebrated nurse Florence Nightingale.

## Florence Nightingale

1820-1910

Born on May 12, 1820, Nightingale is often called "the Lady with the Lamp," Florence Nightingale was a caring nurse and a leader. In addition to writing over 150 books, pamphlets and reports on health-related issues, she is also credited with creating one of the first versions of the pie chart. However, she is mostly known for making hospitals a cleaner and safer place to be.



Donors to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) are providing food, water, medicine, shelter and transportation to Ukrainians and other refugees fleeing Russian invaders inside their country and to those

seeking refuge in neighboring countries. "As of April 4, UMCOR has allocated nearly \$2 million to a broad range of local and regional refugee-related services, and other expenditures reaching into the hundreds of thousands of dollars are in planning." Humanitarian response for people displaced by war or natural disasters is always long-term and involves careful action to alleviate immediate suffering and also to lay the groundwork for unfolding, often unexpected, events. UMCOR has an excellent track record in pulling together resources to cover extended needs."

The conflict in Ukraine may result in as many as 10 million refugees, according to various estimates. Dealing with even half that number of displaced persons is a major international humanitarian



United Methodists across the globe are condemning the Russian invasion of Ukraine. As Christians "we believe war is incompatible with the teachings and example of Christ. We therefore reject war as an instrument of national foreign policy." (2016 Book of Discipline, Social Principles ¶165.C). We also know our God stands with the oppressed and calls on us to support them.

## Cinco de Mago

Many people think Cinco de Mayo (My-O) is Mexico's Independence Day, but it isn't. The holiday of Cinco de Mayo, or *The Fifth of May* celebrates the day Mexican forces defeated French forces in the Battle of Puebla in 1862. Mexico had already won its independence from Spain in 1821, but now France was trying to take over. 4,500 Mexican fighters defeated 6,500 French fighters in the tiny town of Puebla, Mexico. The battle did not end the war, but it became a symbol of unity for the Mexican people. Cinco de Mayo is now celebrated in the United States as well as Mexico.
