Dear Caldwell Church family and friends,

I hope you are enjoying these fall days and nights; the bright sunshine and the crisp-chilly nights; good sweatshirt, sweater, and flannel weather. I love this time of year! If you cannot tell.

Last Sunday October 17th we observed **Laity and Sunday School Teacher** (we included all teachers) Teaching is important, and can be challenging. I am grateful for all those who have been patient with me, and were able to teach me what I am applying in life; God Bless Teachers!

Here is a pocket prayer that I shared with the teachers; **“Dear God, Enable me to teach with wisdom to help shape the mind. Equip me to teach with truth to help shape the conscience. Encourage me to teach with vision to help shape the future. Empower me to teach with love to help shape the world. Amen.** I use and have given this prayer to teachers before, I don’t remember where I found it; it’s not my creation, but I think it a good prayer to keep handy for teaching and preparing message for a time to celebrate the people and leadership in the Church. The Church is made up of people who God uses to help build up, strengthen and encourage one another to grow in faith. God uses people to build the kingdom, and God can use you. I appreciate you all!

The Church is made up of people; people of faith, who respond to God’s Spirit and word. The Greek word ‘*Laos*’ is the word used in the New Testament for people. Another word used along with that is ‘*laity*’; the individual people of a congregation who make up the leadership of the church.

A special thanks to Brad Peoples for bringing last Sunday’s message, and reminding us that we are to follow Jesus and make Disciples. As I am reminded Caldwell Church is blessed with many people willing to serve the Lord; many go unrecognized, but God uses willing servants. We as followers of Jesus are **“called by God and gifted with grace to serve the Lord.”** (Borrowing a phrase shared by a Lutheran bishop last Church conference.)

October is a month in which the Church; its people and leaders faith is highlighted. We speak of faith in several ways. Faith as a noun can identify us as Christian, Jew, Muslim, a Buddhist, or even atheist. As Christians we use faith as a verb to help us live out our faith in words, thought and deeds (actions). For most of us, faith is something we practice like an athlete in training, helping to strengthen us to “run the race”, or be a player in the game. Faith is a gift from God. We can grow in faith, have great faith, and always need more faith. Sometimes we forget just how important faith is.

The Church at times has sidetracked faith development and spiritual needs which is necessary for our salvation. Faith in Jesus our Lord and Savior is vital; for **“without faith it is impossible to please God”** as the writer of Hebrews reminds us in 11:6. Our Wednesday evening study is focusing on faith.

October is Reformation month a time we reflect upon Martin Luther and the other Reformers, who reexamined the need for faith for us to be saved. Next Sunday Oct 31st. Halloween / All Saints Day on the Christian calendar, marks the day in 1517, when Martin Luther posted his 95 Thesis on the cathedral door in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther was attempting to “reform” the Church, not to create a new church, but to transform into what scripture desires it to be; a people of faith.

We will hear more about how God transform us by faith in next week’s letter, and remind ourselves of those who have helped us to develop our faith. Sunday November 7th. is “All Saints Sunday” we will observe the hearing of loved ones names, and remember God’s promises as we partake of Holy Communion together.





National Color Day – October 22, 2021

National Color Day celebrates and enlightens people about the significance attached to each color. Humans have always shared a deep relationship with the colors that surround them. National Color Day is celebrated to recognize the duality of our relationship with colors. We often use colors to our benefit but we seldom talk about the power and influence that our chosen color has on our mood, state of mind, and attention span.

According to a study, **blue** is the world's most popular color, with 40% of people picking it as their favorite.

Red is the first color that an infant can see, as it has the longest wavelength.

The color pink relieves anxiety and stress because of its calming effect and pallia-

United Nations Day – October 24, 2021



On October 24, United Nations Day, we celebrate the anniversary of the UN Charter of 1945.

United Nations Day is celebrated to commemorate the day that 51 countries came together to promote peace throughout the world post World War II.

The main purpose of the United Nations is to maintain world peace and security as well as foster cooperation between nations to solve economic, social, cultural, and/or humanitarian international problems.



What is Communion?



During the sacrament of communion, participants symbolically partake of the body (bread) and blood (wine or juice) of Christ. In so doing, they acknowledge the redemptive power of His resurrection, make a memorial of His sufferings and death, and extend a token of the love and union that Christians have with Christ and with one another.

United Methodists practice open communion, meaning all at worship are invited to partake. The church proclaims that the table of Holy Communion is Christ's table. The table is open to anyone who seeks to respond to Christ's love and seeks to lead a new life of peace and love.

The Lord's Supper, Holy Communion and the Eucharist are all names for this sacrament celebrated by United Methodists. Each of these names highlights an aspect of this act of worship.

"*The Lord's Supper* reminds us that Jesus Christ is the host and that we participate at Christ's invitation." Jesus invites us to take part in the special meal he ate with his disciples the night before his crucifixion, and other meals he shared in homes and on hillsides.

"The term *Holy Communion* invites us to focus on the self-giving of the Holy God which makes the sacrament an occasion of grace, and on the holiness of our communion with God and one another."

Finally, "*Eucharist*, from the Greek word for thanksgiving, reminds us that the sacrament is thanksgiving to God for the gifts of creation and salvation."

The Caldwell UMC celebrates Communion on the first Sunday of each month.
