Greetings Caldwell UMC Family and Friends, This year's National Day of Prayer is Thursday May 6 and the Theme is:

2 Corinthians 3:17 Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.

As you receive this weekly In Touch word the National Day of Prayer has passed, but the theme and the focus of our prayers for America and around the world, remain the same. This is the 70th year for the National Day of Prayer; God continues to bless us as a nation. America is a nation made up of every nation, tribe, and tongue.

Yes, we are richly blessed to have a law that has proclaimed a day of prayer for our nation each year since the law was signed in 1952! Decades later, America still needs our prayers. We need to be praying for all people, every day, for all seven mountains of influence and more, because people are still in need and the Church is still called to prayer, care, share a godly lifestyle. First and foremost, people need to hear the message and experience the love of our Lord Jesus Christ. All have sinned and fallen short, but God's arm is not short, and we have been sent to show and share Christ's message of LOVE, LIFE, and LIBERTY.

Our 2021 National Day of Prayer theme prays: "LORD pour out Your LOVE, LIFE, and LIBERTY." Once again praying and proclaiming a promise of God in our theme verse, 2 Corinthians 3:17(above)

Please pray this prayer, as you read this letter: "Jesus we come now professing that You are our Lord and Savior, the One and only Son of God who came to take away the sin of the world and that whosoever believes in You will not perish but have everlasting life. As our Lord we are clay in Your hands, vessels of Your plans and love. Fill us we pray, to be overflowing vessels and examples of Your LOVE, LIFE, and LIBERTY. We thank you for loving us and commit to showing and sharing Your love. We thank you for our life, and commit to serve You in the awe and respect You deserve, knowing You have put Your image in all of us, and that every person is fearfully and wonderfully made. We thank you for forgiving our sins; for the LIBERTY you have given us, the mercy You have shown us, and You suffered in agony on the cross and the wrath of the Father was upon You, so that I might be found "Not guilty" through Your shed blood. Help me to show compassion and respect to others so that they may hear the gospel and come to know You as Lord and know the release of being a slave to sin. Pour out on us, Lord, and pour through Your Church across America we pray, in Jesus Name. "Amen!"






THIS WEEK IN HISTORY

May 6, 1937 - The German airship Hindenburg burst into flames at 7:20 p.m. as it neared the mooring mast at Lakehurst, New Jersey, following a trans-Atlantic voyage. Thirty six of the 97 passengers and crew were killed. The inferno was caught on film and also witnessed by a commentator who broke down amid the emotional impact and exclaimed, "Oh, the humanity!" The accident effectively ended commercial airship traffic.

May 11, 1888—Songwriter Irving Berlin (1888-1989) was born (as Israel Isidore Baline) in Tyumen, Russia. Although he could not read or write musical notation, he became one of America's greatest songwriters, best known for songs such as *God Bless America*, *White Christmas*, *There's No Business Like Show Business*, *Alexander's Ragtime Band*, *Puttin' On the Ritz*, and *Oh! How I Hate to Get Up in the Morning*.

May 12, 1820— British nurse and public health activist Florence Nightingale (1820-1910) was born in Florence, Italy. She volunteered to aid British troops in Turkey where she improved hospital sanitary conditions and greatly reduced the death rate for wounded and sick soldiers. She received worldwide acclaim for her unselfish devotion to nursing, contributed to the development of modern nursing procedures, and emphasized the dignity of nursing as a profession for women. May 6 is National Nurse Appreciation Day.

Deaconess and Home Missioner
Deaconess / Home Missioner Spotlight

Deaconesses and Home Missioners are laywomen and laymen who are called by God to be in a life-time relationship in The United Methodist Church for engagement with a full-time vocation in ministries of love, justice, and service. Together we form a covenant community that is rooted in Scripture, informed by history, driven by mission, ecumenical in scope, and global in outreach.

The Deaconess and Home Missioner call to ministries of love, justice, and service is defined in Paragraph 1913.1 of the United Methodist Book of Discipline, which states:

Deaconesses and home missioners function through diverse forms of service directed toward the world to make Jesus Christ known in the fullness of his ministry and mission, which mandate that his followers:

- a. Alleviate suffering;
- b. Eradicate causes of injustice and all that robs life of dignity and worth;
- c. Facilitate the development of full human potential; and
- d. Share in building global community through the church universal.

National Have a Coke Day – May 8, 2021

If the very thought of National Have a Coke Day on May 8 makes you want to break into song, you're not alone. Recorded countless times since it was written in 1971, the song "I'd Like To Teach The World To Sing (In Perfect Harmony)" accompanied the brilliant hilltop coke commercial with the words "I'd like to buy the world a Coke" and "It's the real thing" added to make it a haunting and enduring synthesis of coke, peace and harmony that resonated in the "flower power" era and is still sung today.

Begun more than 125 years ago as a cocaine-fueled medicinal elixir, Coke eventually morphed into the non-narcotic soda of choice for the baby-boomers who came of age in the 60s. As the company grew it added other flavors and varieties of the original coke. Today the Coca-Cola Company continues to be relevant as the largest soft drink company in the world, expanding its uniquely American taste into the world's largest emerging markets to become a global brand.

Mother's Day – May 9, 2021



Christian Education Resource for the Whole Family

"Bible Adventure Road Trips" is a Bible-based resource for families to assist in exploring surroundings while having fun together and deepening understandings of the Bible. The resource, developed during the pandemic by an EOC Elder and a graphic artist, takes Christian Education out of the classroom and into the family car, as families take five road trips to some favorite places in their community to take pictures and explore the meaning of assigned Bible passages.

On road trips to a favorite restaurant, lake, river, woods, and cemetery the setting and surroundings provide a deeper insight of assigned scripture. Discussion questions are provided to help families discuss the Bible passage. Families earn points by completing various challenges on each road trip and by attending weekly Zoom meetings. Every family that earns 100 points receives a \$25 grocery gift card for a family picnic.
